### **Summary Narrative**

- The City of Longmont has a total of \$1,284,428 dedicated to their Housing Rehabilitation\Repair\Replacement program and \$1,000,000 dedicated to the Down Payment Assistance Program in both 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> allocations combined. For the City's 2<sup>nd</sup> allocation we are moving forward with \$1,284,428 in our Rehabilitation Program and \$413,500 for the Down Payment Assistance Program, as our Rehab program is expending funds faster than our Down Payment Assistance Program.
- Boulder County has a 2<sup>nd</sup> allocation totaling \$7,906,041 for HAP Programs including Home Access, Temporary Rental Assistance, Rehabilitation, and Clearance and Demo. Currently they have 132 active households for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> allocations. There is approximately \$2,606,410 of project activity costs uploaded for reimbursement. Boulder County is working on uploading and submitting the household project documents that are required for reimbursement.

### **2nd Allocation Comments**

- A total of 27 households have been awarded CDBG-DR HAP Funding from the City of Longmont, of which 8 households carry forward beneficiaries from Round 1. Currently the City of Longmont has 22 households in their rehabilitation programs, 14 closed projects and 8 active projects. These projects include mobile home replacement, reimbursement and repairs. There were a total of 6 households awarded funding from the City's Down Payment Assistance Program, one applicant has since dropped out and purchased a home outside of DR-DPA. Three households have closed, one has placed a down payment on his mobile home, and the other is currently looking for a home.

- A total of 94 households have been awarded CDBG-DR Round 2 HAP funding through Boulder County. Out of the 94 households, 57 households are participating in one program, 24 households are participating in two programs, and 13 are participating in three programs.

  - o Home Access (32)
  - o Clearance and Demo (31)

### **Summary Narrative**

- Intergovernmental Agreements to put at least 1 project under contract are complete for 6 out of 8 Collaborative Partners.
- A total of 19 projects are under contract (Boulder County HMGP Buyouts, Boulder County CDBG-DR Buyouts, and Lyons CBDG-DR Buyouts each count as 2 projects, one for Urgent Need DRGR activity, one for LMI DRGR activity).
- 2 projects (Boulder County HMGP Buyouts Local Match (7 properties) and Town of Lyons CDBG-DR Buyouts (1 property)) expended funds from the 1<sup>st</sup> Allocation.
- 12 projects (City of Boulder Wonderland Creek, City of Boulder Ponderosa MHP Resiliency & Stabilization, Town of Jamestown HMGP Buyouts LMI, Town of Jamestown James Canyon Drive Replacement, City of Louisville Raw Water Diversion, Town of Lyons Debris Removal, Town of Lyons CDBG-DR Buyouts Urgent Need, Town of Lyons CDBG-DR Buyouts LMI, Town of Nederland Roadway, Shoulder, and Drainage Improvements, Boulder County CDBG-DR Buyouts Urgent Need, and Boulder County CDBG-DR Buyouts LMI, Boulder County HMGP Buyouts LMI) have expended funds from the 2<sup>nd</sup> Allocation.

### **2nd Allocation Comments**

• A total of 15 of the 24 project applications submitted are awarded/under contract (63%). (See note below to clarify the difference between number of project applications and number of projects awarded)

- A total of 19 projects are awarded/under contract (even though one project application was submitted for each buyout program, Boulder County HMGP Buyouts, Boulder County CDBG-DR Buyouts, and Lyons CBDG-DR Buyouts each count as 2 projects, one for Urgent Need DRGR activity, one for LMI DRGR activity).
- All 4 buyout programs are underway (acquisition and/or demolition have begun or are completed), and reimbursements have been submitted for all 4 programs.
- Of the non-buyout infrastructure projects, 3 have completed construction, 1 is in construction, 2 are in procurement for
  construction, 3 are in engineering/design, and the City of Boulder closed on the property purchase of Ponderosa Mobile Home Park
  on 8/1/2017 in order to begin the planning phase for infrastructure improvements.
- One project that has completed construction, Town of Lyons Debris Removal, has completed its only two reimbursements, bringing it to 100% complete. This project is in the closeout process.
- Two projects are substantially complete. City of Boulder Wonderland Creek Project completed three reimbursement requests to date, which brings this project to 89% complete. City of Louisville Raw Water Diversion Project completed two reimbursement requests to date, bringing this project to 80% complete (includes additional awarded amount).

Note 1: 3 Buyout Programs for Round 2 that have been awarded (Boulder County CDBG-DR, and Lyons CDBG-DR) will complete income calculations on a household by household basis, therefore the dollar amount awarded is based on LMI/Urgent Need projections. The Boulder County HMGP Match and Jamestown HMGP Match Buyout Programs were calculated based on global match household income calculation therefore the amount awarded is LMI and not based on a projection.

Note 2: One project that has applied for CDBG-DR funding, but that has not yet been contracted for award, the City of Longmont's Resilient St. Vrain Project, is anticipated to meet the Low and Moderate Income National Objective. This project is anticipated to be awarded \$9,286,919 in CDBG-DR funding, which will significantly increase the LMI calculation in the above table.
